If you are making a new will or trust, you can simply include the University of New Haven among the beneficiaries of your estate. If you already have a will, you can make the University a beneficiary of your estate through a simple document called a codicil.

Specifying a percentage of your estate as a bequest is generally preferable to specifying a dollar amount. It means that the beneficiaries of your estate, including tax-exempt not-for-profit organizations like the University of New Haven, will receive the proportion you intend, even though your estate may increase or decrease in value.

BEQUEST

A provision of one's estate plan (will or living trust) that includes the University as a beneficiary, such as:

- · A specific beguest of money or property,
- · A residual beguest of the remainder of the estate after specific beguests, or
- A contingent beguest (gift occurs only if named beneficiaries die before the donor).

PLANNED GIFT

An irrevocable gift that provides a donor (and/or others) with a life income or other benefits and specifies Connecticut Public as the charitable beneficiary

LIFE INSURANCE

A donor may:

- · Take out a policy naming the University as the beneficiary (which is revocable),
- · Take out a policy naming the University as owner and beneficiary (which is irrevocable), or
- Naming the University as the beneficiary of an existing policy or by transferring ownership of the policy to our organization.

QUALIFIED RETIREMENT PLAN

Donors can select the University to be the beneficiary of a tax-deferred retirement plan such as an IRA, 401(k), or 403(b).

Simple ways to include the University of New Haven in your estate plans.



Are you interested in including the University of New Haven in your estate plans but do not want to go through the expense of updating your will? One option is to have your attorney add a codicil to your will. A codicil is a legal document that acts as a supplement to your last will and testament. In it, you can amend your will without having to rewrite your entire original will document. This is often a less expensive way to make a change without redoing your will completely.

Other options are to take stock in your non-physical assets. Planning can ensure you achieve the most tax savings available while meeting your charitable goals. Assigning a charity to the following assets is often as simple as filling out a beneficiary form. This can also simplify the probate process.

- Bank Accounts
- · Life Insurance Policy
- Accidental Death Policy
- Annuities
- CD Accounts
- Vehicle(s)
- Individual Brokerage Accounts
- Retirement Accounts
